CELEBRATE 100 YEARS OF HOBOKEN AND FRANK SINATRA

Cost: \$90 a person (includes museum entry and guided tour, lunch, transportation, driver tip)

Join us as we head to the birthplace of Frank Sinatra and now prime real estate location of Hoboken. First we will visit the Hoboken Historical Museum to see its special exhibit celebrating the "One hundred years of Frank Sinatra." Afterwards we will enjoy experiencing the fascinating history of Hoboken on a narrated coach tour visiting its old and new neighborhoods, including the million dollar homes with the million dollar views of the New York City skyline, Sybil's Cave built in 1835, and Stevens' Institute. NUHEALTH MAMMOGRAPHY VAN

NuHealth, in conjunction with Senator Michael Venditto and Assemblyman Dave McDonough, is hosting a mammography van in the Library parking lot. The program is open to all Nassau County women ages 40 and over. Women who are covered by insurance, Medicaid or Medicare will have their carrier billed and must bring their information card to the screening, along with a prescription from their physician. NuHealth's policy requires patients to be responsible for any copays charged by their carrier. Women ages 50 and older without health insurance will be eligible to be enrolled in a grant program which covers the costs of the screening at no out-of-pocket cost to the patient. **Please contact the Assemblyman's office at (516) 882-0630 to schedule your mammogram.**

I would like to express sincere thanks and gratitude to my children's library staff, volunteers, patrons, performers, and community supporters who made our summer reading program at the Seaford Public Library so successful this year. This year we had over 500 children and approximately 200 volunteers participate. We only hope to increase these numbers each summer as we seek to encourage a love for reading, early literacy, and community involvement.

Our summer reading program ran for a total of 7 weeks. During those 7 weeks we held two summer kick-off events, 20 story times, 8 science workshops, over 50 children's programs for birth to Grade 5, 3 tween movie nights, 5 children's movies, and one large summer reading celebration with nearly 600 adults and children attending.
