Back in early January, there was a great deal of newspaper space and TV news airtime devoted to the 2014 election of retired players to the Baseball Hall of Fame. But, did you know that the Seaford Public Library has its own Hall of Fame? Our Hall of Fame is called the Frank J. Hoschek Memorial Service Award named after the first President of the Library's Board of Trustees.

Our plaque, analogous to the tributes on the walls in Cooperstown, is located on the main floor near the entrance. And, similar to our national pastime's Hall of Fame, it is extremely difficult to be named to the Library's Hall of Fame. In fact, only two individuals have thus far been conferred with the Hoschek Award. Unlike, the upstate New York institution, both of the Library's honorees are women! This short composition is about our initial honoree, Grace W. Pommersheim.

Grace was a valued member of The Friends of the Seaford Public Library since its founding in 1968, having served as both Treasurer and President. She was the President of The Friends for 37 years! Grace loved the Library and entirely understood the unique role it has in the Seaford community. She was also involved with the United Cerebral Palsy Association of Nassau County. Grace and her husband, Frank, lived in Seaford for close to 60 years before relocating to the Cape Ann peninsula in Massachusetts a few years ago. Both were active members in the renowned Seaford Lions Club and faithful parishioners of St. William the Abbot Catholic Church.

This past November, at age 93, Grace passed away. A little bit of the Seaford Public Library and The Friends passed away with her. Please join the Board of Trustees, the Staff and The Friends in remembering Grace W. Pommersheim in your thoughts and prayers. Excelsior, Grace, Excelsior!

VIDEO GAME DESIGN


