Creative Playtime

Choose one of four sessions: Monday, 10:15-10:45am or 11:00-11:30am; Tuesday, 10:15-10:45am; Friday, 10:15-10:45am. **Registration begins Tuesday, January 21st.** A library card and the child's birth certificate are required to register. An adult must remain with the child during the program.
