FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

Tutor.com has changed the way users log in. Since March 1st, library patrons using Tutor.com "Live Homework Help" will now be required to create a user account with their library barcode number as their username and a password they will choose themselves. All users who have already created an "optional" account with their email address and a password to log in (mobile app users, for example), will have to change their account to their barcode number instead. PULSE of NY is a community based patient safety organization dedicated to raising awareness about patient safety through support, education and advocacy. 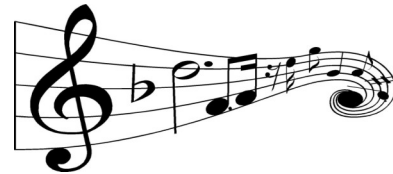
